Our Career Navigators, Karie Stone and Mary Rawlins, have connected students and employers throughout the school year. Here are examples of some of the activities so far.

AMANDA CLEARCREEK



 Students visited and toured TP Mechanical, a commercial contracting company that has services in plumbing, fabrication, HVAC, piping and fire protection. Students toured their distribution center on Hamilton Road in Columbus and learned about an exciting opportunity to become an apprentice with TP Mechanical.

BERNE UNION

 Students completed the mock interview portion of their Career Readiness Endorsement program and interviewed with staff from the following companies: Company Wrench, Crown, Cork and Seal, Worthington Industries, South Central Power, Vinton County Bank, and Krile Communications.



RLOOM CARROLL



 Audra Harden from Fairfield Medical Center presented to students during the schools' Business Casual Friday event. Students learned about entry level positions in areas such as dietary, patient transport, central sterilization, and housekeeping. Audra also informed students about various career tracks in the medical field, opportunities to job shadow FMC employees, and FMC's tuition reimbursement and scholarship program.

LANCASTER HIGH SCHOOL

PICKERINGTON ALTERNATIVE



 OhioHealth recruiters came out to Pickerington Alternative to discuss hiring options starting at age 16. High school graduates can apply for a multitude of jobs and OhioHealth will pay up to \$5600 a year towards education to become a certified ultrasound tech, nurse, X-ray tech, phlebotomist, and other healthcare professionals.
